Thank you for your letter dated the 25th of February, on members of the House of Lords and lobbying firms.

The Code of Conduct for Members states that they must not "seek to profit from membership of the House by accepting or agreeing to accept payment or other incentive or reward in return for providing parliamentary advice or services". The Guide to the Code makes clear that this prohibition extends to "all types of interaction with members of either House, ministers or officials," and this obviously includes any lobbying.

That definition is broad and would cover a "word in someone's ear", a conversation over lunch and the other scenarios you refer to if undertaken by a member on behalf of a paying employer or client. These rules are enforced via a robust system, with an independent Commissioner for Standards considering alleged breaches of the Code and recommending sanctions if an allegation is upheld. When members have been found to have conducted paid lobbying they have been subject to sanctions.

The Conduct Committee has recently concluded a thorough review of the Code of Conduct. While all aspects of the Code were up for consideration, the Committee decided that the clear and comprehensive rules prohibiting paid lobbying did not need substantial adjustment.

The House debated and approved the Review of the Code of Conduct and the Guide to the Code of Conduct on 5 March. In that debate the Chair of the Conduct Committee, Baroness Manningham-Buller, said that undertaking the review was a proactive decision to ensure that the Code is simpler and clearer for members to navigate and to ensure that the House keeps the public interest at the centre of the Code.

I am copying my reply to the Chair of the House of Lords Conduct Committee.

Revealed: bias found in AI system used to detect UK benefits fraud
